Reflection & Discussion

- 1. In both 2 Peter 3:9 and 1 Timothy 2:4, we're told that *God "desires"* all people to be saved.
 - a. What Bible passages/narratives can you use to prove it?
 - b. How would you answer the question: "If God desires that all people should be saved, then why aren't they?"
- 2. Part of Peter's argument for the *delay* of Jesus' second coming has to do with God's PATIENCE:
 - a. Discuss 'biblical patience' as it pertains to your own life: what Scriptures exhort us to being patient? Why? How come patience can be so difficult to practice?
 - b. (EXTRA CREDIT: how do you know when to say "ENOUGH!
 It's time to move on... time to act... time to enforce the
 consequences", etc.?)
- 3. Peter uses the word "repentance" as a synonym for "faith in Jesus".
 - a. How do you define "repentance" (or "repent")?
 - b. Where else in the Bible is "repentance" used with regard to salvation by faith? Where is it used to mean something else?
 - c. How/why should repentance be a part of a Christian's daily walk?
